6.2 Past Simple: affirmatives

We use the Past Simple to talk about activities and events that happened in the past. We often say when they happened: My dad climbed in the Himalayas in 1988.

I had eggs for breakfast.

SPELLING RULES - PAST SIMPLE FORM

Regular verbs

- general rule: infinitive + -ed, e.g. work worked
- verbs ending in -e: + -d, e.g. like liked
- verbs ending in a vowel + a consonant: double the consonant + -ed, e.g. stop - stopped
- verbs ending in a consonant + -y: -y + -ied. e.g. cry cried
